

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## A MESSAGE FROM THE CHIEF OF POLICE

Thank you for reviewing the Mobile Police Department Annual Crime Statistics Report. As you can see, our collective efforts are working, and crime is continuing to trend downward. The City of Mobile reduced all Part I crimes by 17%, and 10% in violent crimes compared to 2022. Mobile experienced reductions in every crime category with exception of robberies, which was up 2%. In real numbers, that's three robbery cases more than 2022.

Over the course of 2022 and 2023, collectively, crime is down more than 20 % percent in all Part I Crimes and 20 % down in violent crimes during that same period compared to 2021. In brevity, the



department's strategic plan is working. Crime is trending down, decremental, which allows us to adjust what works while sustaining the reduction going forward.

While we are proud of our accomplishments, there is much more work to be done. My commitment is to provide the safest city, and highest quality of life for our citizens, while continuing to build trust and transparency with the community. There is little doubt that a solid strategic plan, coupled with partnering with the community, works. We will continue our mission of making Mobile the safest city in America with respect to everyone.

## **GRANTS AWARDED**


For the 2023 fiscal year, the Mobile Police Department was awarded \$10.7 million in grant funding for 22 separate grant programs and awards. Most of the grants allocations are used to purchase equipment and fund overtime pay for officers, although other grant programs were specifically awarded. The 2023 grant fiscal year is October 1, 2022 to September 30, 2023.





















## **CRIME DATA BY PRECINCT**



### Precinct 1


Number of Calls for Service - 38,099

Overall, Precinct 1 had a 14.6% decrease in Part I Crimes.




### Precinct 2

Number of Calls for Service - 43,304 Overall, Precinct 2 had a 21.1% decrease in Part I Crimes.




#### Precinct 3

Number of Calls for Service - 47,767 Overall, Precinct 4 had a 19.4% decrease in Part I Crimes.




#### Precinct 5

Number of Calls for Service - 9,653 Overall, Precinct 5 had a 5.3% decrease in Part I Crimes.



The Internal Affairs Unit conducted 45 investigations involving a total of 48 different members/employees during


### Internal Affairs Investigation Dispositions by Member Race and Gender 2023

Internal Affairs investigations do not imply that a member or employee was complained against individually. An Internal Affairs investigation may be the result of an external complaint against the department, a sub-unit of the department or individual officers, or the investigation may be initiated from within the department. An Internal Affairs investigation may include more than one member/employee with differing dispositions.

### **Citizen Complaints**

There were a total of 70 citizen complaints filed during 2023, which cited 144 areas of concern. Of the 144 areas of concern cited, 48% were unfounded, 20% were found to be proper conduct by the officers, 10% were found to be improper conduct by the officers, 8% were found to have insufficient evidence, 3% were withdrawn by the complainant, 1% were found to be exigent circumstances, and 10% were still pending (under investigation) at the time of this report.


